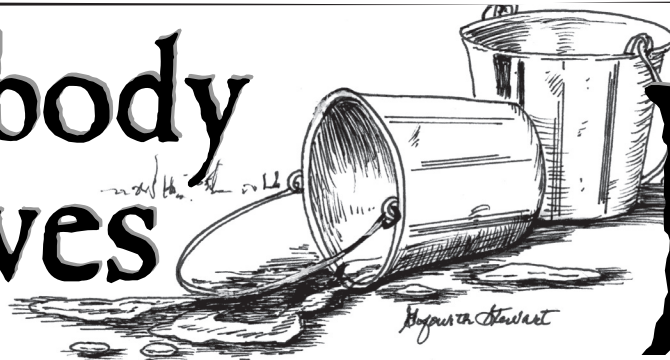


Everybody Loves

Then the children hurried off to school because it was Adam's turn to ring the bell before school started. Anna went on into the classroom while Adam tugged on the bell rope.

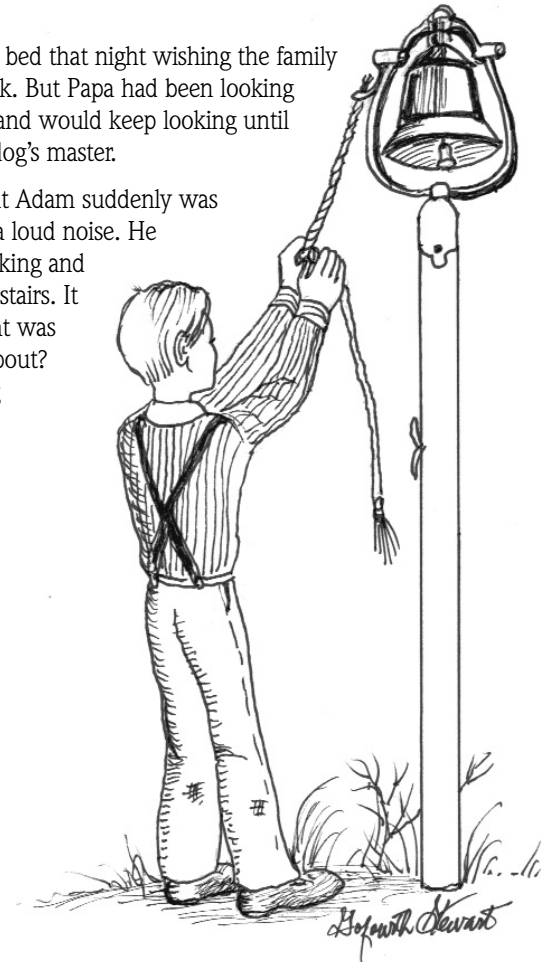
