A Newspaper In Education series highlighting the pioneers of Missouri Journalism

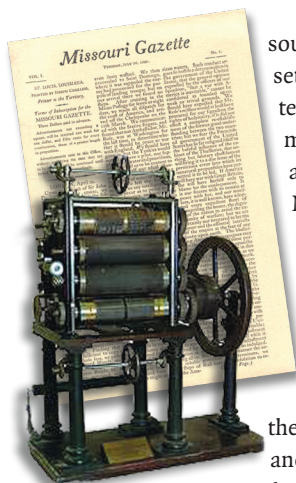
