Who Is Lincoln County Named For?*

Many of you would probably guess that Lincoln County is named after our 16th president, Abraham Lincoln, and that



would be a good guess. But how could you make sure you were right? Who in Missouri compiles this kind of information? The secretary of state is responsible for compiling many kinds of records for Missouri. A lot of the information is found in Missouri's official information manual, commonly known as *The Blue Book*.

The secretary of state is also Missouri's chief election official.

Those wanting to run for elected offices sign up at the secretary of state's office. The secretary is then responsible



for setting up elections and making sure the elections are run smoothly and fairly.

e The secretary of state also makes sure Missouri's historical documents are kept safe. These documents are put in a place called the archives. Another role the secretary of state has is making sure that businesses in Missouri are being

honest and following Missouri's laws. But these are just a few of the many roles the secretary of state has.

The secretary of state, like most of Missouri's elected officials, is elected every four years in November at the same time the governor and president of the United States are elected. There are

no limits on how many times someone may be elected secretary of state.

Secretary of State Facts

 Four secretaries of state have gone on to be governors: John Cummins Edwards (1844), Hamilton Rowan (1861), Warren E. Hearnes (1965), and Matt Blunt (2001).
The only statewide elected official ever impeached and then removed from office in Missouri was Secretary of State Judith Moriarty in 1994 after she let her son sign up to run for office after the filing deadline had passed.
James C. Kirkpatrick was elected five times as the secretary of state and served 20 years, longer than any other statewide elected official. The Missouri State Infornmation Center is named after him.
Roy Blunt (1985–1993) and Matt Blunt (2001–2004) are the first father and son to serve as secretaries of

2 Grades 4-6:

ACTIVITY #2—Do you think there should be a term limit for a secretary of state? Compare and contrast the roles of secretary of state and governor. Why do you think the framers of Missouri's Constitution imposed a term limit on the governor and not the secretary of state?
